

The current False Shepherds

Leaders that have:

- Been self-serving (2-3)
- Neglected the needs of the flock (4)
 - The weak not strengthened (diseased)
 - The **sick** not healed
 - The **injured** not bound up (broken)
 - The **strayed** not brought back
 - The lost not sought
- Ruled the flock with force and harshness (4)
- Failed to protect the flock from danger (5-6)

The current False Shepherds

Result (5-6):

- The sheep were scattered (3x, 5-6)
 - they became prey for wild beasts
 - they wandered in desolate places
 - with none to search or seek for them
- Search or Seek (6):
 - the object of seek is the item you are trying to locate, whereas the object of search is the place you are looking in

The current False Shepherds

Therefore:

- I am against the shepherds (10)
- I will require my sheep at their hand (10)
- · I will put a stop to their feeding(on) the sheep
- I will rescue my sheep

I will put a stop to this! (11-16)

I myself will:

- search for my sheep and seek them out
- rescue them on a day of clouds & deep dark
- bring them out from the peoples & countries
- feed them on the mountains of Israel
- make them lie down in good grazing land
 - seek the lost
 - bring back the strayed
 - bind up the injured
 - strengthen the weak
 - will feed them in justice.

I will put a stop to them! (17-22)

I myself will:

- judge between sheep and goats (Matt. 25:31-46)
- stop their trampling the good grass
- stop their fouling the clear water

 Because you push with side and shoulder, and thrust at all the weak with your horns, till you have scattered them abroad

A covenant of peace (23-31)

Results:

- one shepherd set over them (David)
- banish wild beasts; no more be a prey
- dwell securely and sleep in the woods
- stop their fouling the clear water
- showers in season showers of blessing!
- break the bars of their yoke
- feed them
- give them to know that He is their God


Contrast: John 10:11-13, 14-15

- I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep.
- He who is a hired hand and not a shepherd, who does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees, and the wolf snatches them and scatters them.
- He flees because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep.


The Temple (chs. 40-43)
